#### Reaction to Alternatives

#### **Academics:**

- Consider re-organization to foster collaboration across disciplines.
- Existing geothermal wells should guide placement of new facilities.

#### **Recreation:**

- City is considering sports /fitness complex across road from campus.
- If built, a recreation center should be financially self-sustaining.

#### **Student Life:**

• Combine recreation with wellness and student life in centralized location.

#### **Pedestrian / Vehicular Circulation:**

• Entry from University Pkwy should be enhanced to capture more traffic.













## Campus Structure


- Maintain compact campus organization to promote walkability

- Preserve existing open space and multi-purpose trail






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
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




## Building Use


- Provide expansions for library and science adjacent to their existing location
- Maintain administrative and student service functions in a central campus location






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






### Open Space

- Continue to expand recreation trail and partner with City of Broken Arrow to enhance bicycle connections to campus







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







## **Pedestrian Connectivity**

- Expand recreation trail to the north as campus grows









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







### Vehicular Connectivity

- Reconnect loop to allow access between east and west campus entry









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







## Edges & Gateways


- Maintain high-quality edge along

- Improve wayfinding from University Parkway to Administration Building





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




## **Parking**
