Campus should encourage connections to Regional bike network.















Campus Structure

- Strengthen relationship to Shawnee Bypass








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







Building Use

- Locate compatible programs adjacent to one another to encourage collaboration









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


Open Space

- Enhance frontage with street trees and expanded signage landscaping







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


Pedestrian Connectivity

- Locate building doors to exit into campus open space to activate these areas







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


Vehicular Connectivity

- Minimize pedestrian and vehicular conflict zones








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






Edges & Gateways

- Increase quantity of signs









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




Parking

- Encourage use of public transit and the proposed regional trail network to ease parking demand


