FRESHMEN ADMISSION

MINIMUM REQUIREMENTS

Check out the different ways you can be qualified to attend NSU!

- » ACT 20 (Composite, no writing) OR SAT 1030 (EMRW + M)
- » 2.7 GPA (cumulative, unweighted) & Top 50% of class
- » 2.7 Core GPA in 15 classes required for college entry

CORE REQUIREMENTS

For admissions consideration, students must complete the following 15 units while in High School:

- » English (4 units)
- » Mathematics (3 units)
- » Laboratory Science (3 units)
- » History and Citizenship Skills (3 units)
- » Other (2 units)

REQUIRED DOCUMENTS

Official transcripts can be mailed or sent electronically.

- » Official high school transcript
- » ACT/SAT scores (Not required if over the age of 23)
- » Official final high school transcript once graduated

TRANSFER ADMISSION

MINIMUM REQUIREMENTS

Wanting to transfer to NSU? Let's see if you're qualified!

- » 0-23 credit hours | 1.7 GPA & satisfy all freshmen admission requirements
- » 24 - 30 credit hours | 1.7 GPA (cumulative)
- » 30+ credit hours | 2.0 GPA (cumulative)

REQUIRED DOCUMENTS

Official transcripts can be mailed or sent electronically.

- » Official college/university transcripts from all institutions attended
- » Official high school transcript (if fewer than 24 credit hours post high school not including developmental courses)
- » ACT/SAT scored (if fewer than 24 credit hours post high school not including developmental courses and if age is under 23)

In-State Incoming Freshmen are automatically considered for Freshmen General Scholarships when they complete their admission application. Students admitted before Feb. 1 will be offered the highest scholarship listed in the chart based on their qualifications. Students admitted after Feb. 1 will be awarded if funding is available.

NSU FRESHMEN SCHOLARSHIP OPPORTUNITIES

Must be Oklahoma resident to qualify.

EARLY FRESHMEN SCHOLARSHIPS - Deadline: Dec. 1

Want an early scholarship decision? Students who have been regularly admitted by Dec. 1 and are eligible for a Freshmen General Scholarship will receive a scholarship offer by the end of December.

FRESHMEN SCHOLARSHIPS - Deadline: Feb. 1

Students who have been regularly admitted by Feb. 1 and are eligible

for a Freshmen General Scholarship will receive a scholarship offer by the end of February.

FOUNDATION SCHOLARSHIPS - Deadline: March 1

This scholarship application applies students for a variety of privately funded awards from the NSU foundation.

OUT-OF-STATE SCHOLARSHIPS

Not a resident of Oklahoma? There are several scholarship opportunities for Out-of-State students!

QUAD STATE SCHOLARSHIPS - Deadline: Aug. 1

This award may be available to incoming freshmen and transfer students from Arkansas, Kansas, Missouri, or Texas.

- » Our Quad State Scholarship program waives 100% of non-resident tuition when regularly admitted as an incoming freshman or transfer student and living on campus.

TRIBAL HERITAGE SCHOLARSHIPS - Deadline: Aug. 1

Students from states other than Oklahoma that meet regular admission requirements (not admitted alternatively or on probation) and are a member of a federally recognized tribe, may be eligible for a scholarship waiving 100% of the non-resident tuition.

NON-RESIDENT SCHOLARSHIPS - Deadline: Aug. 1

Incoming non-resident students who are not residents of Oklahoma, Arkansas, Kansas, Missouri or Texas are also eligible for non-resident scholarships.

- » Incoming freshmen that live on campus and have a minimum 3.0 unweighted GPA and a 25 composite ACT score may be eligible for a scholarship waiving 50% of their non-resident tuition.
- » Transfer students that live on campus and have a minimum 2.75 GPA may be eligible for a scholarship waiving 50% of their nonresident tuition.
- » Non-resident tuition is \$288 per hour, in addition to in-state tuition. Students are still responsible for paying in-state tuition. This program waives only a percentage of the non-resident portion.

LEGACY STUDENTS

Legacy students may be eligible to receive non-resident tuition waiver scholarships without the on-campus living requirement. Legacy students are defined as students whose parent and/or grandparent earned a bachelor's or master's degree from NSU and are verified with the NSU Alumni Association.

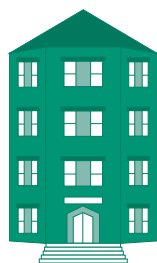

COMPLETE THE APPLICATION FOR ADMISSION

HOW TO APPLY

Review of applications for Fall '22 begins **Sept. 1, 2021**. Applications accepted on a rolling basis through **Aug. 1, 2022**.

- » Complete the NSU application at: Apply.nsuok.edu
- » Select the semester you would like to begin classes
- » Create an account with a personal email address the first time you log in
- » Pay the \$25 non-refundable application fee
- » Submit your application

After submission, log back into your application to check its status and see if the required documents have been received. You will be given an admissions decision within 5 - 6 business days, via mail.

SUBMIT YOUR OFFICIAL TRANSCRIPTS AND ACT, SAT OR NSU RESIDUAL SCORES

Your application is not complete until these are received.

APPLY FOR FINANCIAL AID AND SCHOLARSHIPS

Financial aid and scholarships cannot be awarded until you've been admitted but you can apply now!

APPLY FOR HOUSING

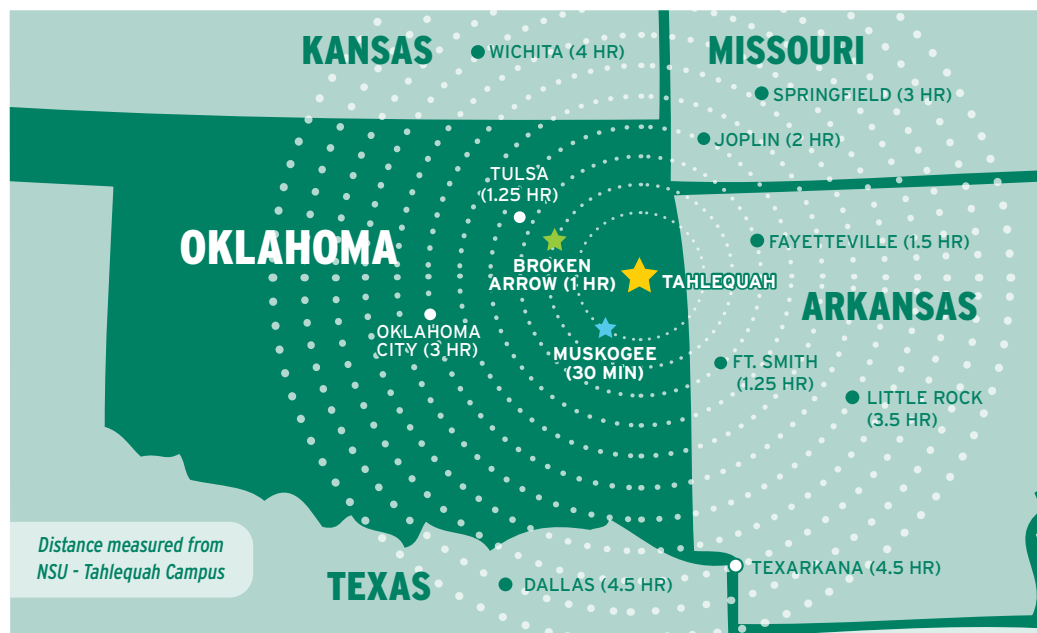
